SRBI from the Perspective of the International Reading Association

Dr. Karen Costello, an Administrator for School Improvement for East Lyme Schools, will present a status report on Connecticut's SRBI model. Dr. Costello's presentation will be followed by two breakout sessions featuring **Dr. Barbara Marinak** from Penn State University and **Dr. Kay Stahl** from New York University who will be discussing their states' models. After lunch, these IRA RTI Commission Members will participate in a panel discussion. They will be joined by **Dr. David Monti**, Professor Emeritus at CCSU, and **Dr. Cheryl Dickinson**, a professor of literacy at SCSU, who will also serve as an active moderator.

Dr. Costello served on Connecticut's SRBI Advisory Panel and contributed to Connecticut's Framework for RTI. Dr. Marinak, collaborated with Marjorie Lipson and Mary Zolman, to co-author the chapter, "New Roles for Educational Leaders: Starting and Sustaining a Systematic Approach to RTI," in the book, *Successful Approaches to RTI*.
